# DWR makes drastic cut in California water supply

Bay area television channel CBS 5 reported recently that California's Department of Water Resources will cut supplies to water districts by up to 90 percent starting January 1, 2009.

A water district spokesperson confirmed the cut, calling it "pretty serious" in light of the last two extremely dry years California has had. The DWR's Wendy Marin said, "We are looking at going into a third potentially dry year. We have actually drawn down our reservoirs...we are actually having difficulties delivering water this year."

According to CBS 5, the state delivers water for nearly 25 million Californians each year through 29 agencies, all facing cutbacks. California gets its state water from the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and snowmelt from the Sierra Nevada mountain range.


Some water districts do not use state water, instead relying on their own reservoirs. The CBS 5 article reports that those districts are also seeing possibly dangerous low levels of water.

DWR reports that by 2050, scientists project a permanent loss of at least 25% of the Sierra snow-pack.
